Objectives

The Rome Workshop is organized in the framework of the six NOVELOG city workshops.

The workshop will bring together stakeholders from Rome and other European cities, in order to present and discuss their experiences on solutions implemented, examine possibilities of transferability and solution adoption by other cities, identify current market trends in the logistics sector. The workshop aims at achieving stakeholder cooperation and common ground for exchange of information and experiences on implementing sustainable Urban Freight Transport (UFT).

Rome is the capital of Italy and of the Lazio region. With 2.9 million residents in 1.285 km2, it is also the country's largest and most populated municipality and fourth largest city in the European Union, by population within city limits. Thus, undoubtedly, the urban freight distribution represents a great challenge for the city and the new Mobility Master Plan pays particular attention to this issue.

The city of Rome has been involved in EU projects, as Smartset, and now is focused on Novelog Project and CityLab, to contribute to the reduction of both congestion and CO2 emissions thanks to a more efficient urban freight distribution.

The workshop is structured as follows:

- B) Keynote speeches from major industry players
- C) Experiences and innovations for UFT
- D) Open moderated discussion

Reaching Rome

• Fiumicino Airport/Rome Termini

Leonardo express non-stop train service departing every 30 minutes.

The train departs from **platforms 23/24** in Termini Station, and is guaranteed year around, even in the event of strikes. The cost of one way ticket is **14 euro per person**.

Tickets can be bought on line <u>www.trenitalia.com</u> (print the pdf file you will receive via email with confirmation of purchase) as well as self-service machines, authorized travel agencies and authorized selling points.

Ciampino Airport/Rome Termini

Atral bus (run by Cotral)

To Termini Station – buses depart from Ciampino airport **Gate 2** between 04.30 and 22.50. Tickets cost; €3.90 one-way and €6.90 return. You can either buy them once on board, at the airport hall of arrivals, or other authorised selling points.

• by train:

Rome can be conveniently reached by train. Trains to Rome depart from all over Italy several times a day. You can easily reach the Protomoteca Hall from Termini train station by taking the metro line B (Laurentina direction) and get off at the stop Coliseum. Then nice walk along Via dei Fori Imperiali (piazza Venezia direction), or take the bus numbers 51,85, or 85. Get off the bus at the stop "Via dei Fori Imperiali – Piazza Venezia" (2 stops). Then turn left.
