EUROCITIES session on EU funding for Urban Nodes

The event will provide an overview of funding and financing opportunities for the development of mobility projects in cities part of the Trans European Networks. The Connecting Europe Facility (CEF) is one of the main sources of funding for the trans-European transport network projects. Since 2014, some CEF calls address the urban nodes i.e. the cities on the network. Speakers will introduce the new 2016 calls and draw some lesson learnt from successful and unsuccessful projects from the previous round of applications.
